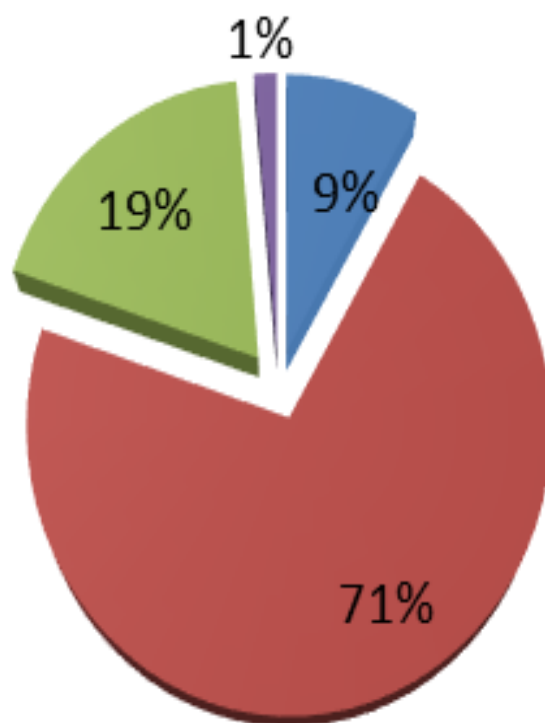


Direct beneficiaries targeted within year II: **70 Communities in 7 Dioceses in Myanmar within year II.**

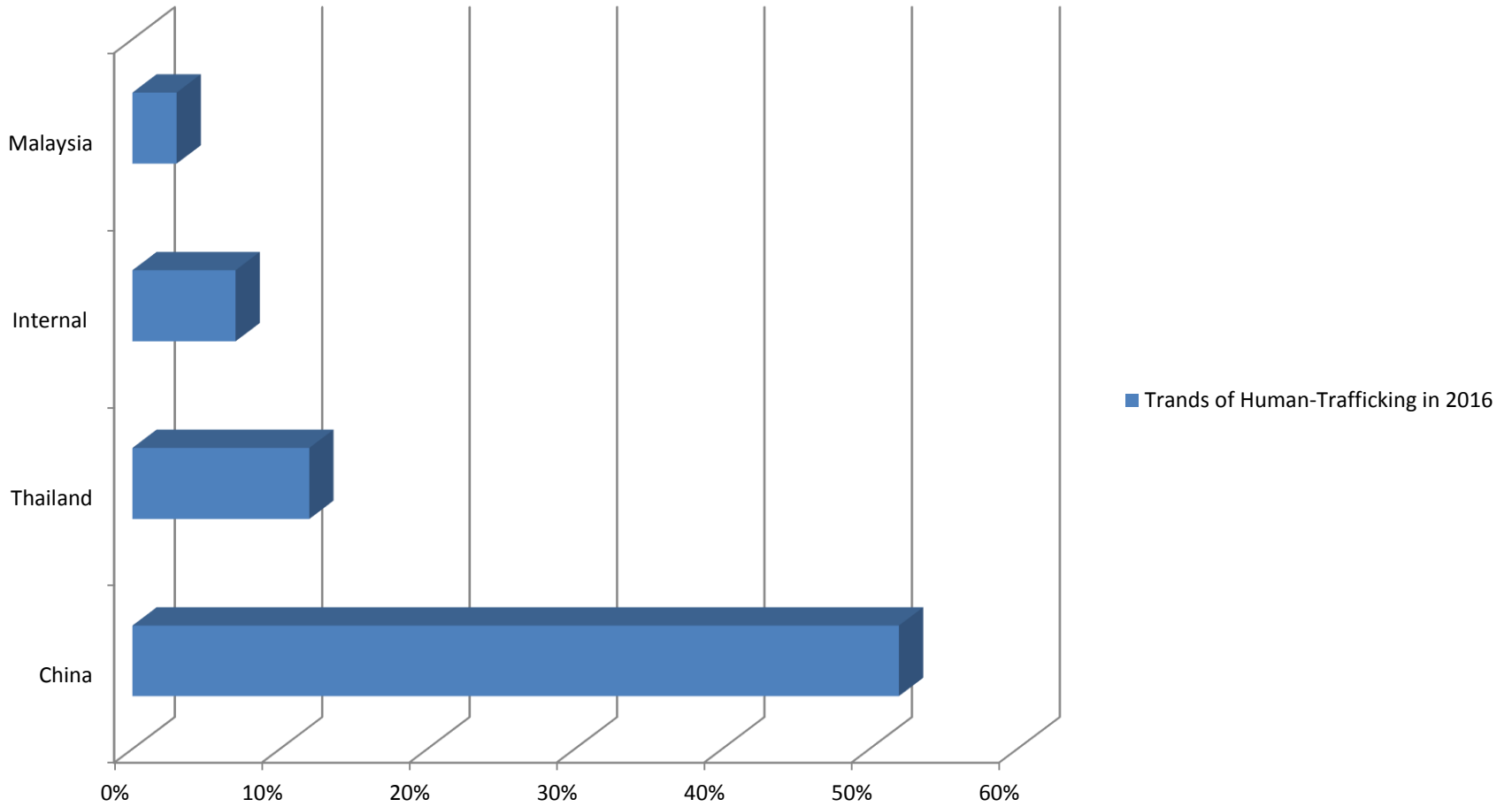
- **4,200 communities' members** including youths received awareness on AHT and safe migration
- **70 villages** well established community watch groups and anti-human trafficking networks.
- Indirect beneficiaries likely to benefit from the project II: **347,200 Community members from 70 villages**

Activity 1.1.1 – Awareness sessions in communities

- 70 villages
- Project field staffs held more than 2 sessions in each villages
- 4448 (1990 Male and 2458 Female) of communities people reached.

Activity 1.1.2 – Mainstreaming training to religious actors in targeted area

- 1034 (619 Male and 415 Female) religious actors attended the training

Activity 1.1.3 – Conducting pre departure orientation training (PDOT)

- 2 times pre departure orientation training in each 7 dioceses
- 1705 (619 Male and 415 Female) people received the training.

Activity 1.1.4 – Celebration of Myanmar Anti-Human Trafficking Day and Migration Day

- 1769 (871 Male and 1030 Female) people participated in the celebration

Activity 1.1.5 – Producing IEC materials regarding Trafficking and Migration

- 70 targeted villages and 14 parishes in Yangon are distributed
(30000 pamphlets are distributed for information sharing in different parishes which are not targeted area)

Activity 1.2.1 – Regular awareness session for CWGs

- Total of 497 (272 Male and 268 Female) joined CWG regular awareness session though some are not a member of CWGs.

(620 times for each 70 villages)

Activity 1.2.2 – Exchange visits for community watch group

- 445(224 male and 268 female) CWG members from 70 villages participated

Activity 2.1.1 – Conducting coordination meeting with Department of Social Welfare, Department of Labor

- 2 times of coordination meeting was conducted

Activity 2.1.2 – Participation in National level coordination meeting

- 2 times participated in national level coordination meeting (Asian migrant labor forum at Nay Pyi Taw and pre consultation meeting at Patheingyi Regional level)

Activity 2.2.1 – Conducting Coordination Meeting with Religious, Congregations and Church Leaders

- 294 (153 male and 151 female) people joined at coordination meeting

Activity 2.2.2 – conducting coordination meeting with stakeholders

- 380 people (237 male and 171 female) participated in coordination meeting
- # (15) organization in Yangon region level
(23) organization in Shan state level
(6) organization in Kayin State level
112 cases are helped through referral .

- # 1 case conference meeting was conducted in 1 region
- # 50 survivals joined for gathering and their experiences are noted for evidence based information .

112 cases are received referral help through collaboration
